Introduction

This brochure contains brief descriptions of tours available. Please book your excursions as soon as possible since certain shore excursions can accommodate only a limited number of participants. We recommend that you purchase them in advance of your cruise in order to avoid disappointment.

Restrictions

Please note there are certain excursions that for safety reasons, age, weight and/or height restrictions apply. These restrictions are imposed by the individual vendor and Royal Caribbean International must comply accordingly.

Tour Availability

Please note that not all tours are available on all ships. Tour prices and itineraries are in effect at the time of printing and are subject to change without notice.

Responsibility

Shore Excursions are offered for sale by Royal Caribbean International as a convenience to our guests. While great care has been taken to offer the finest excursions available at each port, these tour services are provided by independent tour operators, and Royal Caribbean International will not be responsible or liable for any loss, damage, injury, costs or delays resulting from, or in connection with, your use of these services.

Scheduling of Shore Excursions

When planning your shore excursions, please keep in mind the following:

1. Most tours depart from the pier. At the completion of the tour, you will be returned to the pier unless you elect to leave the tour en route. In that case, it will be your responsibility to secure transportation back to the pier.
2. In most ports it is possible to participate in more than one tour. When planning your day, it is advisable to plan at least one hour between your tours.
3. All guests are to be aboard the ship no later than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled sailing time. The scheduling of all shore tours conforms with this requirement. However, if you elect to leave a tour en route, or go ashore on your own, it is your responsibility to return to the ship on time.
4. Kindly note that tour times provided online may be earlier than the vessels scheduled arrival to a port of call. The time listed may be in local time as provided by the tour operator. The most accurate tour departure time will be provided directly onboard the vessel.

Refunds and Cancellations

No refunds are made for failure to use all of the described services included in the tour price. Cancellations by guests must be made prior to the closing deadline advised directly onboard the ship. Under no circumstances will refunds be made after an excursion has commenced.

SeaPass Card

Remember to take your SeaPass Card with you whenever you go ashore. It will serve as your Identification Card which you will be required to show to the officer on duty before re-boarding the ship.

Weather

Most tours will operate rain or shine. However, full refunds will be made to guests holding tickets for canceled shore excursions. In the event of a tour cancellation, every effort will be made to accommodate guests on other available tours.

Children's Pricing

Unless indicated, children's pricing is valid for children 12 and under. Guests under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Activity Level

The Shore Excursions presented in this brochure require the guest to use a motor coach or other form of transportation which will require the guest to step up 2 to 3 steps, approximately 10 inches high each. Most (but not all) motor coaches used can accommodate collapsible wheelchairs. However, it should be noted that escorts, drivers, guides, and shipboard staff are not obliged to lift guests into the vehicles. Lift-vans and/or coaches are not available in all ports of call. Tendering may preclude guests in wheelchairs from going ashore at certain ports of call. For further information, please check with the Shore Excursion desk on board immediately upon arrival.

To assist our guests in choosing their excursions, all tours have been graded according to the level of activity they entail. Please refer to the tour symbol(s) that appear(s) in each tour description. Kindly note the below symbols act only as a guideline and guests must make their own judgment regarding participating in tours. The symbols represent the following:

Mild



To fully participate may require leisurely walking over primarily even surfaces. There may be a limited number of steps, a minimal amount of cobblestones or uneven surfaces, and some standing for extended periods of time.

Moderate



To fully participate may require extended periods of walking over even and uneven surfaces, steep terrain and/or water activity in a slight current. There may be steps, inclines, cobblestone surfaces, and extended periods of standing. Participants with physical limitations should take this into account.

Strenuous



To fully participate may require extended periods of physical exertion, extensive walking, climbing, or biking. There may be numerous steps, inclines, cobblestones, and other rough terrain throughout the excursion. These excursions are the most active and have been designed for participants in excellent health and very good physical condition.

Meal



Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. If a meal is served on an excursion, it will be designated with this symbol.

Dress Code



Conservative attire is recommended when going ashore on this tour. No exposed shoulders or knees. Short pants and tank tops are not acceptable.

Shopping



Time permitting, limited shopping is available during the tour.

Waiver



All participants on this tour are required to complete a waiver and/or release form. This document will be distributed by the tour operator prior to commencing the tour.

Bar Harbor, Maine

BY01 - Acadia National Park

PRICE: ADULT: 48.00 / CHILD: 36.00 USD

DURATION: 2 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



Featuring one of the most scenic drives on the east coast, Acadia National Park is the second-most visited Park in the United States. This tour takes you along the 27-mile Park Loop Road offering spectacular coastal, mountain and forest scenery.

You will pass through the quaint town of Bar Harbor to view some of the charming Victorian Mansions built by America's rich and famous at the turn of the century. Entering the National Park, your journey along Park Loop Road will take you along the ocean's edge passing Otter Cliff and Thunder Hole where the ocean swells converge against the granite cliffs to create a thunderous roar. Depending on traffic and weather conditions, a photo stop will also be made at Thunder Hole or the Jordon Pond House.

Your tour culminates with a photo stop from atop the 1530-foot Cadillac Mountain, the highest point on North America's Eastern seaboard. With a 360-degree panoramic view, you will see how glaciers carved through the granite cliffs to form a beautiful landscape of lush forest, lakes, and valleys.

Note: The stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse or foggy weather conditions a stop at the Visitor's Center will be substituted. Walking is at guest's discretion.

BY02 - Best of Acadia National Park & Mount Desert Island

DURATION: 6 Hours Approx.



Make the most of your day in Bar Harbor as this tour encompasses all of the highlights of Acadia National Park, the scenic areas of Mount Desert Island including Northeast Harbor, Somesville and Seal Harbor, and a spectacular lobster lunch. One of the most scenic drives on the east coast, you will enjoy a journey along the 27-mile Park Loop Road offering spectacular coastal, mountain, and forest scenery. Along the ocean's edge, a photo stop will be made at the famous Thunder Hole, where ocean swells converge against the granite cliffs to create a thunderous roar. Continuing to Northeast Harbor, you will pass the sandy beach and hidden cove of Seal Harbor, where Mount Desert Island's most famous residents enjoy their summer homes, including Martha Stuart, the Rockefellers, and the Fords. Pulled fresh from Maine's ocean water, you will enjoy a lobster lunch drizzled with butter, fresh bread, coleslaw, potato salad, and sweet corn on the cob. For dessert, you won't want to miss one of Maine's local favorites, a piece of homemade blueberry pie. (Steak is available upon request for non-lobster eaters).

Following lunch, a short photo stop will be made at the Jordon Pond House to enjoy the view of the Penobscot Mountains and Bubbles Hill from the observation deck before continuing to the summit of the 1530-foot Cadillac Mountain. A photo stop will be made at the top to enjoy the sweeping vistas and natural beauty of Mount Desert Island and Acadia National Park.

Note: Walking at Cadillac Mountain and Jordon Pond House are at guest's discretion. There are approximately 300 yards of walking over even and cobblestone surfaces. Please note that the stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse or foggy weather conditions.

BY03 - Acadia National Park Guided Bike Tour

DURATION: 2 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



Experience the famous carriage trails of Acadia National Park by crisscrossing some of the most scenic areas of the park. The trails were constructed by John D. Rockefeller Jr. beginning in 1913; upset by a ruling allowing automobiles onto Mount Desert Island, he decided to provide a haven free of any motorized traffic. The trails - "roads" is actually a better description - recently underwent a multi-million-dollar refurbishing, and they are in excellent condition.

You'll be custom-fitted with a 24-speed mountain bike, designed specifically for hard-packed gravel such as you'll find on the carriage trails. Your professional guide will stop often to offer interpretive material about the island's history and lore. Anyone of average physical condition can take part in this tour. It is suggested that you dress in loose, comfortable layers, and take a wind/waterproof jacket. Comfortable walking, hiking, and/or tennis shoes must be worn. Please note that the minimum age to participate in this tour is 12 years of age.

In order for participants to enjoy this tour, you must be able to pedal a bicycle approximately 5 miles over moderate terrain with some uphill climbs. Participants should be aware that there are certain inherent risks involved with any cycling excursion.

BY04 - The Best of Bar Harbor

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.



Take in the best of Bar Harbor and Mount Desert Island on this half day excursion.

Your tour features the natural landscape of Acadia National Park and Cadillac Mountain, a visit to the Lobster Oceanarium for a hands-on look into this fascinating undersea world of the lobster fisherman and a journey back in time to one of Bar Harbor's beautiful cottages. Departing the pier, your scenic drive along the Park Loop Road includes all of the highlights of the Acadia National Park Tour. Your journey along Park Loop Road will take you along the ocean's edge passing Otter Cliff and Thunder Hole where the ocean swells converge against the granite cliffs to create a thunderous roar. Depending on traffic and weather conditions, a photo stop will also be made at Thunder Hole. You will make your way to one of the most scenic spots in all of Acadia National Park, Cadillac Mountain. Highest point on North America's Eastern Seaboard, you will enjoy the 360-degree panoramic view and see how glaciers carved through the granite cliffs to form a beautiful landscape of lush forest, lakes and valleys.

Continue to the Lobster Oceanarium and Museum where visitors of all ages have the opportunity to see and learn about the lobster industry. The Oceanarium features fascinating displays, an authentic lobster fishing boat as well as plenty of hands-on exhibits. A licensed Maine lobstermen will explain the life cycle of these succulent creatures, demonstrate how lobsters are caught and eventually make their way from the depths of the ocean to your dinner table.

Continuing to Bar Harbor's historic district, enjoy the unique ambience of the Turrets mansion one of Bar Harbor's last remaining summer mansions overlooking Frenchman Bay. The Turrets is on the National Register of Historical Places and is a fine example of the opulent lifestyle of the Gilded Age. Your guide will be happy to share the tales of a by-gone era when America's wealthiest families made Bar Harbor their summer playground. Note: This tour will require guests to walk and stand for approximately 30 minutes at the Lobster Oceanarium and 20 minutes at the Turret's. Note: The stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse, foggy weather conditions.

BY06 - Four Master Schooner and Cadillac Mountain

DURATION: 3 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



Take in Bar Harbor's stunning scenery by land and sea on this relaxing half-day excursion.

Embark your motorcoach for a scenic drive through Acadia National Parks spectacular coastal, mountain and forest scenery. Pass through the quaint town of Bar Harbor to view some of the charming Victorian Mansions built by America's rich and famous at the turn of the century. Take in the spectacular scenery of the National Park and enjoy a photo stop from atop the 1530-foot Cadillac Mountain, the highest point on North America's Eastern seaboard. With a 360-degree panoramic view, you will see how glaciers carved through the granite cliffs to form a beautiful landscape of lush forest, lakes, and valleys.

Returning to sea level, you will embark the Margaret Todd, a new 151 foot, four-masted schooner for a relaxing sail on Frenchman Bay. Your captain will navigate this magnificent vessel around the Porcupine Islands offering panoramic views of the seaside village of Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park with the imposing Cadillac Mountain as a backdrop. Along the way your captain provides commentary on the geological points of interest as well as wildlife such as the porpoise, seal, osprey and bald eagle that are often sighted in the area. The sailing portion of the tour will vary in duration from 1 1/2- 1 3/4 hours depending on wind and weather.

Please be advised that the schooner may be under both sail and motor power depending on wind conditions. The schooner will operate rain or shine so dress in layers and bring along a rain jacket. Bring your binoculars! The stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse, foggy weather conditions.

Note: This tour is not available after October 15, 2009.

BY08 - Acadia Carriage Ride & Cadillac Mountain

DURATION: 3 Hours Approx.



One man-made aspect of Acadia National Park that never fails to impress and fascinate visitors is the 57 miles of rustic carriage roads which weave through the park. After a short drive along a portion of the Park Loop Road, you will travel back in time to the turn of the century as you board a horse-drawn carriage for a one hour scenic ride around Day Mountain. Built by philanthropist John D. Rockefeller between 1913 and 1940, the beautifully designed gravel byways afford a unique and close-up view of the Acadia National Park landscape. Built with hand cut stone and rock, the extensive motor-free trails are enjoyed today by hikers, bicyclists, horse riders, and carriages.

Continuing along the Park Loop Road, you will make your way to the 1530-foot Cadillac Mountain, highest point on North America's Eastern seaboard. With a 360-degree panoramic view, you will see how glaciers carved through the granite cliffs to form a beautiful landscape of lush forest, lakes, and valleys.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 200 yards over even and gravel surfaces and climb two large steps to board the carriage. If weather conditions do not permit a stop at Cadillac Mountain, a stop at the Visitor's Center will be substituted.

BY09 - Acadia National Park & Lobster Bake

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.



This tour encompasses all of the highlights of the Acadia National Park Tour and the spectacular scenery of the Park Loop Road, as well as a traditional "Downeast" Lobster Bake.

Departing from the pier, you will enjoy a scenic drive on the 27-mile drive on Park Loop Road offering spectacular coastal, mountain and forest scenery. With much of the land donated by John D. Rockefeller, you will also see the romantic stone-cut bridges and evidence of the elaborate carriage trails built by his family at the turn of the century. Home to over 50 species of animals, keep your eyes peeled for bald eagles and white tail deer as you make your way around the Park Loop Road. Along the ocean's edge, a photo stop will be made at the famous Thunder Hole, where ocean swells converge against the granite cliffs to create a thunderous roar.

A visit will be made to the summit of the 1530-foot Cadillac Mountain, the highest point on North America's Eastern seaboard. From this vantage point you will enjoy the sweeping vistas and natural beauty of Mount Desert Island and Acadia National Park.

You will then be treated to a true "Downeast" lobster bake in a beautiful setting along the coast. Pulled fresh from Maine's ocean water, you will enjoy a lobster drizzled with butter as well as, fresh bread, coleslaw, potato salad, and sweet corn on the cob. For dessert, you won't want to miss one of Maine's local favorites, a piece of homemade blueberry cake or pie. (Steak is available upon request for non-lobster eaters).

Note: The stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse or foggy weather conditions a stop at the Visitors Center will be substituted. Lunch will be served at the end of the excursion on the morning departure and at the beginning of the excursion on the afternoon departure.

BY10 - Cadillac Mountain & Rinehart Pavilion

This tour encompasses all of the highlights of the Acadia National Park Tour and the spectacular scenery of the Park Loop Road, as well as a taste of one of Maine's home baked blueberry deserts at the scenic Rinehart Pavilion.

Departing from the pier, you will enjoy a scenic drive on the 27-mile drive on Park Loop Road offering spectacular coastal, mountain and forest scenery. With much of the land donated by John D. Rockefeller, you will also see the romantic stone-cut bridges and evidence of the elaborate carriage trails built by his family at the turn of the century. Home to over 50 species of animals, keep your eyes peeled for bald eagles and white tail deer as you make your way around the Park Loop Road. You will then proceed to the summit of the 1530-foot Cadillac Mountain, highest point on North America's Eastern seaboard. From this vantage point you will enjoy the sweeping vistas and natural beauty of Mount Desert Island and Acadia National Park. You will then continue to the Rinehart Pavilion located on the estate grounds formerly owned by Mary Roberts Rinehart, a mystery writer of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Surrounded by an eight-sided glass wall, you will enjoy a commanding view of Frenchman Bay, Bar Harbor, and your ship as you enjoy a piece of home baked blueberry pie or cobbler, coffee or tea.

Note: The stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse, foggy weather conditions.

BY11 - A Step Back In Time Walking Tour

DURATION: 1 Hour 30 Minutes Approx.



Step back in time to turn-of-the-19th century when Bar Harbor was the world's most exclusive resort. Return to the days when fabulously wealthy summer residents tried to out do each other with their lavish parties when multi-millionaires' pockets

bulged with thousand-dollar bills.

A costumed guide will take you back to a Bar Harbor that no longer exists, sharing tales of a magnificent time when the financial barons of America made Mount Desert Island their summer playground. You'll learn about the society matron who ordered imported crystal champagne glasses by the case so her guests could toss them against the oceanside boulders of Frenchman's Bay and the insecure couple who thought they could impress others by giving away priceless diamonds and jewels, and much more. You'll learn the history of the area, but most of all you'll find out how the truly wealthy lived: the grand parties, the manicured estates, and the mansions that seemed to stretch forever. Your guides are so knowledgeable, and they so realistically portray their characters, they'll soon have you convinced that they really did live in Victorian Bar Harbor.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.75 mile (1.25 hours of slow walking) over even and gravel surfaces, narrow pathways with 2 to 3 steps. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

BY12 - Ocean Trail Hike

DURATION: 2 Hours Approx.



This casual and invigorating 90-minute walk following Acadia Park's famous Ocean Trail is an excellent way to take in the sights, sounds, and smells of the New England Coastline.

Your walk will take you along some of the most breath-taking scenery in Acadia National Park. Your tour begins with a short ride along the Park Loop Road to your departure point for the Ocean Trail Hike. Noted as one of the most scenic drives on the east coast, Park Loop Road offers spectacular coastal, mountain and forest scenery. Located along the rugged coast of Acadia National Park, the Ocean Trail is one of the most beautiful areas of the park. As you begin your hike, your experienced naturalist guide will introduce you to the unique and diverse ecosystem of the Island as well as the geology, natural history, and legends of the park and surrounding islands. Learn about the founding fathers of Acadia and the important role John D. Rockefeller and George Dorr played in the development of the park. You will also be introduced to the fascinating tale of the lobster industry and the techniques used to harvest this delectable creature.

Please note the walk is conducted at a leisurely pace along a dirt and gravel path and is suitable for casual walkers. The distance covered is approximately 1- mile (90 minutes). Please dress in layers with sturdy, comfortable walking shoes and bring a water/wind proof jacket.

BY13 - Guided Sea Kayak Tour of Frenchman Bay

DURATION: 3 Hours Approx.



Learn why sea kayaking is one of the nation's fastest-growing water sports. Using super-stable tandem kayaks (two people to a boat); you'll discover how easy it is to develop a fluid stroke that will propel you efficiently through the waters of Frenchman Bay. A Registered Maine Guide will provide basic instruction as well as commentary on the geology, marine environment, history and lore of coastal Maine. You'll glide by the famed Porcupine Islands and you'll have a chance to see such varied wildlife as harbor seals, porpoises, cormorants and bald eagles. From the unique perspective of your kayak, you'll view many of the mansions that line the shorefront of Bar Harbor. Sea kayaking is safe and easy to learn, and this tour is suitable for beginners. Anyone of average physical condition can participate. Guests should wear light quick-drying trousers or shorts, tennis shoes or sandals (they will get wet), and bring a wind / waterproof jacket, hat, sunglasses and bottled water. Please note, that to participate guests must be 12 years of age or older, weigh 250 pounds or less and stand 50 inches or more.

BY18 - Jordon Pond House & Cadillac Mountain

DURATION: 3 Hours Approx.



Enjoy a scenic drive through Acadia National Park's spectacular coastal, mountain and forest scenery en route to Jordon Pond House for an elegant lunch. Located in the heart of the park, Jordon Pond House has been serving tea and popovers to travelers and tourists since establishing this unique tradition in the 1780's. This idyllic setting, overlooking Jordon Pond with the Bubble Mountains in the distance, provides great photo opportunities and It is here that you will enjoy you lunch featuring the famous popovers served with strawberry preserves and butter, seafood chowder, mixed green salad, Atlantic poached salmon with dill sauce, curried chicken salad and ice cream for desert.

Following lunch, you will make your way to the summit of the 1530-foot Cadillac Mountain, the highest point on North America's Eastern seaboard. From this vantage point you will enjoy the sweeping vistas and natural beauty of Mount Desert Island and Acadia National Park.

Note: The stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse or foggy weather conditions a stop at the Visitor's Center will be substituted.

BY21 - Maine Lobster Experience and Cadillac Mountain

DURATION: 3 Hours Approx.



Embark your motorcoach for a scenic drive through Acadia National Park's spectacular coastal, mountain and forest scenery. Pass through the quaint town of Bar Harbor to view some of the charming Victorian mansions built by America's rich and famous at the turn of the century. Following a brief photo stop at the summit of Cadillac Mountain, return to sea level and step aboard Lulu, an authentic Lobster boat and ply the calm waters of Frenchman Bay to learn about the lobstering business firsthand on this fascinating combination tour.

See how lobster traps are hauled, set and baited. During your cruise you'll see firsthand how these succulent creatures get from the bottom of the ocean to your dinner plate! Learn about the habits, conservation efforts of lobster and understand the difference between hardshells, shedders, shorts, culls and keepers. Along the way, enjoy the antics of the seal colonies as you quietly cruise past the rock ledges where they rest and catch a glimpse of the picturesque Egg Rock Lighthouse while the Captain points out the sites and shares local history and folklore.

Note: This tour may operate in reverse and will operate rain or shine so dress in layers and bring along a rain jacket. The stop at Cadillac Mountain will not be made in adverse or foggy weather condition. This tour is not available after October 21, 2009.

Boston, Massachusetts

BX02 - Scenic Boston

PRICE: ADULT: 44.00 / CHILD: 34.00 USD

DURATION: 2 Hours Approx.



Enjoy the highlights of Boston as this panoramic tour takes you past the city' most important and scenic sites.

One of the city' most attractive spots, you will see Copley Square bordered by the architectural wonders of Trinity Church and the Boston Public Library. Continuing through the upscale residential area of Back Bay and along Newbury Street, you will pass a number of upscale boutiques, and trendy cafes as you make your way past the Public Garden. In the heart of the city and overlooking the green oasis of the Boston Common, lies one of the most elegant and wealthiest neighborhoods of the city, Beacon Hill. Passing the gold dome of the Massachusetts State House, you will see the steeple of the Old North Church in the distance, where Paul Revere ordered two lanterns hung to signal that the British Redcoats were approaching. You will also see the Old South Meeting House where the Boston Tea Party began.

At the conclusion of your tour, you will have the option to be dropped off at Quincy Market/Faneuil Hall or return directly to the ship's pier.

Note: The tour itinerary may vary according to traffic conditions.

BX03 - Historic Boston & Cambridge

On this tour, enjoy all the highlights of the Scenic Boston Tour as well as a short walk through the Historic North End and a visit to Cambridge.

From this vantage you will see Portland's working waterfront, including lobstermen pulling traps, tugs and tankers and maybe catch a glimpse of some of the wildlife that thrive in this environment. You will make your way back to dry land and then return to the pier.

Please note that guests must be able to climb the eight steps to embark and disembark the amphibious DUCK vehicle.

Enjoy the rustic beauty of a 19th century horse drawn wagon ride through the city of Portland.

Your matched team of magnificent horses will tour you comfortably through the narrow streets of the city Henry Wadsworth Longfellow named a "Jewell by the Sea". Your experienced guide will point out all the historical sites of this magnificent Jewell we call Portland. Your tour will include Portland's working waterfront, the Eastern Promenade with its spectacular views of Casco Bay and the Calendar Islands, the Portland Observatory which was used to notify the city of a ships arrival, Monument Square with its tribute to those who gave their lives for freedom, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's home and Longfellow Square. You will also pass by the Portland Museum of Art designed by I. M. Pei, and the unique combination of architectural styles that make up this vibrant city. Your guide will also discuss the history of Portland from its beginning as a part of Massachusetts to its independence, and how the city was destroyed four times and rebuilt.

This tour will provide you with an opportunity to see Portland as very few people see it - in a horse drawn carriage.

PW15 - Lighthouses of Maine

The spectacular rocky coastline nearby Portland Maine is studded with lighthouses dating back over 200 years. On this half day tour you will see three prominent lighthouses and visit the Museum of Portland Head Light.

Departing the pier you'll drive through historic Portland passing by, the Eastern Promenade offering a panoramic view of Casco Bay, the Portland Observatory, the new Arts District, as well as the thriving commercial and business districts. Visit Bug Light, a steel structure lined with brick, that was first lighted in 1875 as an aid to navigation for this busy port. In addition, you will enjoy the Liberty Ship Memorial dedicated to the 266 ships built on the site during WWII. Commonly known as American Ugly Ducklings these vessels were the workhorses of the WWII fleet, carrying cargoes of grain and mail, ore and ammo, trucks and troops in the fabled horizon-filling convoys. Then it is a short jaunt to the Spring Point Ledge Lighthouse, a typical "sparkplug" style lighthouse constructed of brick on a cylindrical cast-iron caisson. Many vessels ran aground on this dangerous ledge before requests from seven steamship companies in 1891 convinced the government to build a lighthouse.

Then travel along Cape Elizabeth's rocky coast to Fort William's, once a military outpost for coastal defense and now home of Maine's oldest lighthouse. First illuminated on January 10, 1791, Portland Head Light has since stood at the gateway to Portland Harbor for mariners traveling Maine's perilous coast. Here you will have ample time to explore the grounds and visit the impressive museum located in the former lighthouse keepers quarters. The museum chronicles the history of the Portland Head Light and Fort Williams through permanent exhibits displaying original artifacts and documents, navigational aids, lenses, video displays, models and photography.

Please note that the entrance fee to the small museum at Spring Point Ledge Lighthouse is not included in the tour

PW16 - Mt. Washington & The Cog Train

Portland is your gateway to the White Mountain National Forest and the Mount Washington Cog Railway; an experience of a lifetime! Enjoy the two hour scenic motorcoach ride from Portland, Maine into New Hampshire for spectacular views and vistas of the White Mountains.

At the Marshfield Base Station you will climb aboard the worlds first mountain-climbing cog railway to the summit of Mt. Washington, New England's highest peak. Back in 1869 this new technology of toothed-gears, rack rails and tilted boilers was an engineering marvel. Experience this modern marvel firsthand on your journey aboard a fully restored car powered by an authentic coal-fired steam train just as tourists did over a century ago. Take in the ever-changing surroundings, the magnificent views, the sights and sounds of unique steam locomotives in action, and some of the steepest Railway tracks in existence. On a perfectly clear day the view from the summit of Mount Washington spans four states, Quebec, and the Atlantic Ocean. On an overcast day you might even climb above the clouds. A box lunch will be served aboard the train.

At the conclusion of the train ride, you will have a short break to browse in the Base Station gift shop before the two hour coach ride back to your ship in Portland, Maine.

This is truly one of the worlds great railway journeys. This tour operates rain or shine. It is recommended that guests dress warmly with layered clothing. It can be especially cold 20-25 degrees cooler on top of Mt. Washington - elevation is 6,288 feet (1,917 meters). A diesel locomotive may be substituted.

Join the crew as they hoist the sails, take command at the ship's wheel, or simply relax and enjoy the scenery as you ply the calm waters of Casco Bay. Under full sail you will glide past Portland's bustling waterfront, secluded islands, historic forts and lighthouses perched along Casco Bay. Your guide will point out the sites along the way.

You'll have approximately 20 minutes to explore and chat with the vendors.

Then get ready for a thrilling experience! Upon arrival at Fallsview Park you will be completely outfitted with lifejackets and rain gear, before beginning your ride. But even still, you will get wet from the waves and the sprays! You will board a high-speed jet boat for an adventurous 20-minute trip! You'll jet through and across the famous Reversing Falls, with your captain taking you over and around the rapids. Afterward, you will be treated to a traditional lobster roll at the picnic grounds overlooking the falls.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 150 yards over even and gravel surfaces with 40 steps. Guests must be a minimum of 13 years old and a minimum of 42 inches in height to participate. This tour is not recommended for guests with heart conditions, back problems, or who are pregnant. Guests will get wet on this tour. It is recommended that you take a towel or change of clothing. This sightseeing boat will take you up close to the famous Reversing Falls, where the mighty Bay of Fundy causes the St. John River to reverse direction and flow upstream, and from the boat, you'll get an excellent view of the powerful whirlpools swirling about and rapids rushing, if the tide permits.

You'll also cruise around the harbour, alongside your cruise ship, and past a number of significant Saint John sights. This is a Bay of Fundy Experience you won't want to miss.

This is a walking tour, and guests will join a guide for an approximately 1/4 mile walk from the pier to the New Brunswick Museum and Sightseeing Boat location.

Passing through the west side of the city of Saint John, you will stop for a fascinating visit at Carleton Martello Tower, a great place to survey the harbor from the old stone fort. The tower was built during the War of 1812 as a precaution against an American attack, and although sixteen such towers were constructed across Canada in the early nineteenth century, this is one of the few remaining. Next, you'll stop to view the famous Reversing Falls Rapids at Fallsview Park, touted as the sight no one should miss on a visit to Saint John. From the bluffs, your guide will explain that twice daily the powerful tides of the Bay of Fundy rise faster than the river can empty. When this happens, the mighty tides push the river water upstream, causing the rapids to run in the opposite direction and the St. John River to flow backwards. You'll continue to Fort Howe, which sits atop a cliff and has fine views of the harbor below where you will have a photo opportunity. Your coach will also pass the Irving Mansion, Rockwood Park, Loyalist Burial Grounds, and Historic Trinity Royal. Walk through the Old City Market on Germain Street, where local folks have been purchasing fresh fruits, vegetables, fish and meats since 1876. You'll have approximately 20 minutes to explore and chat with the vendors before reboarding your coach and returning to the ship. Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.25 mile over even surfaces. There are several steep steps at Carleton Martello Tower to enter the various levels.

Upon your return to Saint John, your guide will escort you through the Old City Market, where local folks have been purchasing fresh fruits, vegetables, fish, and meats since 1876. You'll have approximately 20-minutes to explore and chat with the vendors at the market. Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 300 yards over even surfaces with 5 to 10 steps. Walking at the Sea Caves is at your discretion. Low-heeled comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

You will be delighted by the rivers rich history as you travel past cable ferries, a covered bridge, light houses, and catch glimpses of the various wildlife that call this abundant ecosystem home. Be taken back in time with interpretation on the native settlements, lumbering operations, and when steamboats worked as the highway system between river communities. Comfortable walking shoes, and dress in layers are recommended.

Guests must be able to walk approximately 300 yards over uneven surfaces with 10 to 15 steps.

Ride through Fundy National Park, where you can often spot various bird species and even an occasional moose. Then, get ready to discover Hopewell Rocks - the icon of New Brunswick. Here, you'll see the famous flowerpot rocks created by the clash of continents, carved by melting glaciers, and then sculpted by the highest tides in the world. Your guide will explain how twice daily one hundred billion tons of water creates tides that can rise up to 50 feet. Enjoy a buffet lunch at the High Tide Cafe after exploring this fascinating Tidal Discovery Site.

Your first stop at Woolastook Park, is a great place to survey the harbor. Next, you'll stop to view the famous Reversing Falls Rapids at Fallsview Park, touted as the sight no one should miss on a visit to Saint John. From the bluffs, your guide will explain that twice daily the powerful tides of the Bay of Fundy rise faster than the river can empty. When this happens, the mighty tides push the river water upstream, causing the rapids to run in the opposite direction and the St. John River to flow backwards. You'll continue past Fort Howe, which sits atop a cliff and has fine views of the harbor below.

You'll have approximately 20 minutes to explore the Old City Market and chat with the vendors before reboarding your coach and returning to the ship.

The town of Sussex has created a fascinating feature with 11 murals lovingly and skillfully painted onto the side of the town's buildings, 15 more are under creation for this one of a kind art gallery. Contrast this with a visit to New Brunswick's famous 100 year old Covered Bridges and we have a great day out on a trip that will appeal to every member of your family. Welcome to Sussex, the Mural capital of Atlantic Canada.

Sussex is a picture-perfect rural community nestled in the beautiful countryside of New Brunswick. Streets are lined with heritage buildings, quaint shops and various restaurants.

In contrast to the Murals are New Brunswick's Covered Bridges of which there are only 64 remaining. We will visit 3 today dotted in and around the community of Sussex, but keep alert as we may see some more on the journey. 100 years ago these bridges formed the major link in the road system. Close your eyes and use your imagination, you can almost hear the wagon wheels rattling over the floor boards which in winter were covered in snow to ease travel by sleigh.

The 3 bridges we will visit on our tour are, Tranton C.B., Salmon River C.B., and Plumsweep, C.B. before traveling into Sussex itself for the tour of the murals. How many can you spot?

After a short drive through Sussex we will be stopping at the Broadway Cafe for refreshments and an opportunity to purchase your souvenirs of Sussex before returning to our coach for the 45 minute drive back to Saint John. There will be photo opportunity stops at the Covered Bridges and amongst the murals in Sussex.
